7. Post-Reading Activities

- 1. Look closely at one chapter of <u>Charlotte's Web</u>. How did E.B. White build your interest? What was the climax in that chapter? How were things resolved?
- 2. Talk to someone who currently lives or grew up in an agricultural area. Has farm life changed? (This might be a fun zoom-call conversation.)
- 3. Do different generations in your family have different views of <u>Charlotte's</u> <u>Web</u> based on how they have lived?
- 4. Read more books by E.B. White, they include: <u>Stuart Little</u> and <u>The</u> <u>Trumpet of the Swan</u>. Do you see any similarities? After you read these books, you may want to watch movies that have been made about these books and <u>Charlotte's Web</u>.
- 5. Read the <u>Little House on the Prairie</u> books by Laura Ingalls Wilder. These books include illustrations by Garth Williams.
